RICS will appoint an impartial mediator whose role is to enable discussion, agreed outcomes between parties and to set up and moderate these discussions. Mediation is well suited to the Telecoms sector where discussions can sometime be challenging and difficult to facilitate. We will appoint professionals to help the parties have a balanced conversation and achieve mutually acceptable results. This is far better than not dealing with problems which can sometimes lead to matters ending up on court or other proceedings.
