Background

RICS is the principal global professional body for valuation, management and development of land, real estate, construction and infrastructure. As a result of market respect and demand for our profession's standards and qualifications, highly talented individuals choose to qualify, commit to lifelong professionalism and work to our standards. We inspire more diverse entrants into a purpose-rich profession that plays a major role in shaping the world we live in. Our professional qualifications continue to remain relevant in a world disrupted by new technology and advances in big data.

Sustainable 21st century professional body

We continue to generate the financial ability to invest in our vision; the profession and our employees are highly engaged in both our direction and purpose; those who engage with us and consume our products and services are satisfied that these add real value.

We recognise that the world has changed significantly over the past 3 years since the strategy was developed, and particularly in the last 12 months. This has resulted in changing market, member, and public expectations of RICS. To ensure that we can continue to effectively deliver our purpose as a professional body, RICS' Governing Council has commenced a strategic review of the Institution.



Process for undertaking the review

We want to ensure that our strategy is built on a foundation of evidence and insight, developed through collaboration and co-creation, which meets the demands of our members and stakeholders wherever they are and whatever area of surveying practice they are in. We are therefore developing a strategic review process focussed on consultation and split over three key stages:

- evidence gathering, engagement and analysis, which will run from March until May
- strategy development, which will take place in May and
- drafting and review, which will take place in November.

The final outcomes, alongside any revision to RICS' future business plan, will be approved by Governing council in November 2021.

This document introduces our approach to the first stage of this review, ensuring that we have the evidence and insight required to allow Governing Council to develop a new strategy for RICS.

How we are gathering evidence

Our evidence gathering and consultation activities will run from 3 March to 9 April 2021, and cover the following key strategic issues:

- the purpose of RICS as a professional body
- governance and transparency
- qualification and entry to the profession
- standards and assurance
- membership engagement and involvement
- membership experience
- membership value proposition and
- future priorities for the profession.

Short consultation papers have been provided covering the background on these issues, what we are currently doing, and our development plans. These consultation documents can be found **on our iConsult platform** in English, and are translated into French, German, Simplified Chinese and Spanish **on the RICS website**.

In order to undertake an effective review of our strategy, it is important that we have the opportunity to hear views from as many members and stakeholders as possible. We are therefore planning a range of activities in which you can feedback your thoughts to us:

- a direct email for general views review2021@rics.org
- structured written consultation exercises on the eight topics noted above, which can be found here
- open virtual roundtables, which members can join and provide feedback, based on the eight topics above
- targeted focus groups with stakeholders and advisory groups and
- a wider sentiment survey of members.

Next steps

After the consultation closes, the written responses will be analysed, together with the feedback from events and meetings. Governing Council will use all feedback to review its strategy and priorities for the future, and will publish a summary of the responses and explain how these have shaped its thinking.

The final directional outcomes alongside any revisions to RICS' future business plan will be approved by Governing Council in November 2021.
