# Scholarship for RICS Diploma in Adjudication

The Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS), Dispute Resolution Service (DRS) is providing an industry scholarship for the RICS Diploma in Adjudication programme to attract talent and diversity into alternative dispute resolution in the construction- related industry. The scholarship will provide one place on the RICS Diploma in Adjudication commencing in June 2026. The successful candidate will be enrolled onto the full programme of teaching and assessments.

RICS DRS is committed to seeing greater diversity in the provision of construction adjudication and is also a keen advocate of Women in Adjudication in the construction industry. In recent years, we have seen a slow but steady increase in women undertaking the RICS Diploma in Adjudication, completion of which is one of the criteria for inclusion onto the RICS Panel of Adjudicators. RICS is for the first time offering a free scholarship place on the RICS Diploma in Adjudication commencing in June 2026. This scholarship is open to women who are working in the construction-related sector\* and who have an ambition to be involved in dispute resolution and adjudication specifically. This scholarship signals RICS's commitment to encouraging greater diversity among those studying for our qualification and in the industry generally.

# RICS Diploma in Adjudication

The RICS Diploma in Adjudication in Construction is an 18-month distance learning programme designed to provide candidates with an in-depth knowledge of the legal principles, best practice and competencies required to act as an adjudicator, or as a party representative in adjudication proceedings, or to prepare clients for the adjudication process.

\* This scholarship is also designed to help address the under-representation of non-lawyers in dispute resolution in the sector, and so is aimed at applicants engaged in construction *per se*, project management, quantity surveying, architecture, construction engineering, claims consultancy and other similar occupations



# Eligibility requirements

To qualify to apply for the scholarship applicants must be:

- A university graduate with a degree classification
- A woman with a position/role in the construction-related sector and a strong motivation to advance in the sector
- Able to demonstrate role modelling behaviour, especially toward female advancement in the construction-related sector
- Engaged in construction *per se*, project management, quantity surveying, architecture, construction engineering, claims consultancy and other similar occupations
- Based in the UK

# **Application process**

All applicants are required to complete the application form in Appendix II and return it to RICS via email (<a href="mailto:drseducation@rics.org">drseducation@rics.org</a>) by Monday 5 January 2026.

Shortlisted applicants will also be required to submit a 1,500 word essay suitable for publication as an article as described below in key dates and deadlines.

In addition, applicants will need to submit one professional reference. An applicants' referee should have a significant standing in the construction industry, and should be someone familiar with the applicant's work, such as a line manager or mentor. A referee should provide comments in support of the applicants' application.

Applicants also need to submit a confirmation from their line manager that they will support the applicants' study and provide the applicant with time off to attend tutorials and assessments.

Applicants will need to confirm that they have read and agree to be bound by the RICS DRS Education General Terms and Conditions and the Scholarship Terms and Conditions.

Applicants agree that RICS will be entitled to publish their name and relevant profile in the communications surrounding the announcement of the results of the scholarship competition. This scholarship opportunity is being provided by the RICS Dispute Resolution Service as part of its commitment to Women in Adjudication in the construction-related sector.

The scholarship will fund the programme (tutorials and assessments), not including the purchase of reading materials or, if necessary, any resit of assessments.



Successful completion of the RICS Diploma in Adjudication will allow the candidate to be placed into the pool of candidates who will be considered for recruitment for the RICS President's Panel of Adjudicators (as and when there are vacancies or a need to expand the Panel).

## Key dates and deadlines

- Deadline for applications will be Monday 5 January 2026 (including confirmation from the applicant's line manager and a reference)
- Applications will be reviewed, and a shortlist of successful applicants published by 4
   February 2026
- Shortlisted applicants will be invited to submit a 1,500 word essay by 23 February 2026.
  The essay should be suitable for publication as an article in the sector press and on
  social media. It should be on a topic of their choice related to the challenges, role and
  advancement of women in the construction-related sector, ideally including reference
  to relevant dispute resolution and/or conflict avoidance mechanisms.
- Applicants' essays will be reviewed, and scholarship finalists announced by 16 March 2026
- Scholarship finalists will be invited to a virtual interview in w/c 13 April 2026
- The successful candidate will be selected and notified by 1 May 2026
- The RICS Diploma in Adjudication programme commences on 10 June 2026

Scholarship Terms and Conditions are below:

What is the Scholarship?

The award is not a cash payment to the recipient. The amount is automatically deducted as discount (Discount) from the total course fee for the Diploma. The scholarship is the course fee discount which will be directly applied to your course fee account for the Diploma. No alternative/equivalent monetary payment will be made.

Only the Applicant who has been selected for the Scholarship will be informed of the result.

Eligibility Requirement for Scholarship

This is set out in the Application Form.

Terms And Conditions of Scholarship

- 1. The decision of the selection panel is final for the Scholarship.
- 2. If successful, you will be enrolled on the course with the Discount applied and by attending the Course you agree to abide by our Charter, Regulations and Policies in force.
- 3. We may make changes to these Terms from time to time and the version that is applicable to you will be those that were in force at the date of your application.
