


Competency assessment

- managing the post-appointment process
- discussions between experts.

Pathway to RICS Accredited Expert Witness status

The RICS Expert Witness Certificate is not a status in itself. It is, however, an important step towards becoming an **RICS Accredited Expert Witness**. Below is a breakdown of the process:

Requirement

Step 1 Successfully complete the RICS
Expert Witness Certificate course*
or equivalent training from an
institution recognised by RICS

Step 2 Meet the accreditation criteria in full and submit an application (separate application fee applies)

Step 3 Pass the panel interview

Outcome

Holder of the RICS Expert Witness Certificate

Eligible for panel interview



- join the President's Panel of Dispute Resolvers and Expert Witnesses and be considered for nominations by RICS.
