The hospital features nearly 200 additional beds, improved stroke care, expanded medical services, and a clinical training hub. Designed with community input and environmental responsibility, it aims to reduce patient travel and improve local healthcare accessibility while achieving the equivalent of a 4-star Green Star rating for sustainability.




