Guy Bradley is Chairman of John Swire & Sons (H.K.) Limited, Swire Pacific Limited, Swire Properties Limited and Hong Kong Aircraft Engineering Company Limited. He is also a Non-Executive Director of Cathay Pacific Airways Limited.

Before taking up his current role as Chairman, Guy was the Chief Executive of Swire Properties, responsible for the Company's overall management and strategic direction. He joined the Swire group in 1987 and has worked with the group in the Hong Kong SAR, Papua New Guinea, Japan, the United States, Vietnam, the Chinese Mainland, Taiwan region and the Middle East.

Guy is a Vice-President of The Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong, a General Committee member of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and Chairman of the Chamber's Investment Committee. He serves as a member of the Chief Executive's Council of Advisers and as a Special Counsellor to the Our Hong Kong Foundation. Guy is also a member of the Hong Kong-Europe Business Council (Hong Kong Section), as well as the Riding for the Disabled Association's Voting Committee.

Colliers – Capital Markets and Investment Services Team

In 2024, Colliers' CMIS team led Hong Kong's real estate market by launching the first Restructuring Property Services unit, integrating investment brokerage with insolvency expertise. This innovative approach secured 8 en-bloc transactions, outpacing competitors, and attracted new capital from Singapore and East Asia. Key deals included the HK\$1.8 billion Li Fung Centre sale and premium pricing for 152 Queen's Road Central. The RPS unit, the first bank-approved restructuring service, ensured transparency and protected creditor recoveries across 8 properties. By transforming distressed assets into high-value opportunities and brokering complex deals like 3 San Lau Street, CMIS set new industry standards.

Colliers, JINGDONG Property – Transaction of LiFung Centre

The LiFung Centre transaction, Hong Kong's largest industrial deal of 2024, saw Colliers represent both M&G Real Estate (vendor) and Jingdong Property (buyer) in a HK\$1.8 billion sale. Bridging legal, cultural, and jurisdictional gaps, Colliers ensured compliance with RICS standards and HKSAR laws.

The deal, involving a mainland Chinese e-commerce giant's first major Hong Kong investment, boosted market confidence and reinforced Hong Kong's logistics hub status. Colliers' teamwork facilitated deal origination, market analysis, and due diligence, while innovative underwriting maximized the property's logistics and data centre potential. The LEED Gold-certified building was primed for BREEAM certification post-sale.

Nan Fung Property Management – AIRSIDE

AIRSIDE, a 1.9 million sq. ft. mixed-use complex in Kowloon's prime Kai Tak district, comprises a 32-story Grade A office tower and a vibrant shopping mall. Its "Wholeness" urban lifestyle concept fosters connections between people and nature through art, eco-consciousness, and low-carbon initiatives. The mall features specialty retail, leisure facilities, green spaces, and pet-friendly amenities. AIRSIDE's management team delivers exceptional tenant services, upholds rigorous standards, and drives vibrant community engagement. Through robust financial management, a collaborative workplace, and innovative technology, the team ensures operational efficiency, sustainability, and industry recognition, establishing AIRSIDE as a premier eco-conscious, community-focused destination.

Kai Tak Sports Park Project Team (Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau, HKSAR; Rider Levett Bucknall Limited; Kai Tak Sports Park Limited; Leigh & Orange Architects; WSP (HK) Limited; Hip Hing Engineering Company Limited; Populous; Simon Kwan & Associates and Ove Arup & Partners Hong Kong Ltd)

The construction scale and complexity of Kai Tak Sports Park was unparalleled among similar projects in Hong Kong. Kai Tak Stadium with indoor bowl cooling consisted of 15,000 tons of steel structure, 55,000 m² of façade coverage, retractable roof, stage pocket and fire monitor. KTSP Project team utilized full BIM to achieve transformative innovations including the precise heavy lifting of 6,000 tonnes trusses, rationalization of façade panel with varying colour coating from 43,000 to 27,000 pieces and patented AI technology to coordinate and generate drawings. KTSP saved up to 1,000 tonnes of steel and reduced carbon emissions through design optimisation.

Great Eagle Group – Oyster shell upcycling pilot programme

The Great Eagle Group leads Hong Kong's first oyster shell recycling programme with The Langham, Hong Kong, Eaton HK, and Green Island Cement Group to address the city's 3,000-tonne annual shell waste. Since March 2023, it has diverted 14+ tonnes from landfills through systematic collection, cleaning and processing, establishing Hong Kong's first oyster shell recycling supply chain. This cross-sector collaboration demonstrates circular economy success through measurable waste reduction, reuse of shell waste in cement products, and creation of a scalable, replicable model. By repurposing waste into valuable resources, it delivers both environmental impact and commercial innovation worthy of professional recognition.

Hongkong Land Limited – The Hubs

Hongkong Land addresses Hong Kong's housing challenges by pioneering a community hub model in partnership with Caritas and the government. Since 2021, we transformed underutilised spaces into two community hubs in Tsuen Wan and To Kwa Wan, serving over 6,000 beneficiaries from low-income families. The Hub 13 is the first of its kind designed specifically for ethnic minorities living in SDU, while Our Common Home achieved a 66% reduction in embodied carbon using an innovative and sustainable painting system, in comparison to standard painting materials. We demonstrate how professionalism, sustainability, collaboration, and innovation can create a lasting social impact.

Swire Properties Limited – Leading the way: Swire Properties' sustainable development triumph and global recognition

SPROPS advanced sustainability holistically, focusing on NbS, NZR and SFM. Aligning with the TNFD framework, SPROPS enhanced transparency in environmental risk management. The company integrated biodiversity considerations into developments.

Achieving a 40% carbon emission reduction (Scope 1 & 2) since 2019, SPROPS utilised energy efficiency initiatives and renewable energy. Count on Scope 3 carbon emission, tenant engagement via the GPP and GKI was indispensable. To support sustainability initiatives, 70% of bonds and loans were sourced from green financing. These efforts earned SPROPS the top spot in the DJBWI 2024, with continuous recognition from other global indices like GRESB and HSCSI.

Architectural Services Department (Property Services Branch) – Application of robotics technologies and innovative construction methods in facilities upkeep

Innovation is one of the core themes in the Annual Plan of ArchSD. Under the lead of Chief Maintenance Surveyor, members of InnoCIG actively explore robotic solutions and innovative construction methods to address challenges in delivery of facilities upkeep services. Through the application of various robot prototypes for building inspections and maintenance services, it demonstrates the success of developing robotic solutions. With collaborative efforts with research institutes and different stakeholders, InnoCIG's robotic solutions generate positive impact on the facility management industry and promote the use of robotic technologies in facilities upkeep.

Arup, South Development and Sustainable Lantau Office, Civil Engineering and Development Department, HKSAR, The University of Hong Kong (HKU), The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) – Carbon removal potential of trees for New Development Area (NDA) of Hong Kong

This groundbreaking project redefines urban tree carbon measurement. A collaborative effort by Arup, universities, and government addresses the critical gap in existing assumptions about tree carbon removal. Through field measurements and laboratory testing, the team developed an empirically grounded methodology for measuring carbon storage in selected tree species. The project created a dynamic live database tailored to HK's climate and ecological context, serving as a valuable reference for future urban and landscape design. This initiative will significantly contribute to HK's carbon neutrality goals by establishing a credible database, guiding carbon neutrality efforts, and maximising environmental benefits.

The project team is led by MTRC, in collaboration with Llewellyn and Partners Company Limited (HKU spin-off company) and Hensen System Engineering Limited as consultants specialising in Digital Twin technology and energy management respectively, to explore the integration of automation, IoT, and big data analytics for digital-twin and building asset management at 2IFC. AutoTwin, a leading integrated asset and carbon management digital platform with automation of built-asset was developed by LPC. It is seamlessly integrated with Hensen's cloud-based big data analytics, enabling system-wide energy optimisation. This innovative integration drives the digital transformation, fostering building sustainability and carbon neutrality.

Through the Digital Twin Framework, and with the use of the Standardisation Guideline, NDA projects can effortlessly and easily develop a Digital Twin for real-time data, spatial analytics, and scenario modelling to support smarter, greener, and more resilient city development across project stages. The Project sets a benchmark for digital transformation in the built environment - equipping the industry with the tools towards innovation and collaboration beyond geographic boundaries.

The properties of MTR Corporation Limited encompass 16 shopping malls, four office buildings, and more than 110,000 residential units across 57 property estates. To explore the potential of cutting carbon and greenhouse gas emissions from its estate, MTR implemented a pilot project - The development of an integrated Al solution to enhance energy efficiency and customer experience at the ELEMENTS, MTR Mall in West Kowloon. This initiative resulted in significant annual energy savings and improved building performance, optimising the operational strategy.

Turner & Townsend Limited, Development Bureau and Civil Engineering and Development Department, the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China – Framework Contract for Ground Investigation Services

In 2024, the Development Bureau, Civil Engineering and Development
Department, and Turner & Townsend transformed the way ground investigation
services are procured in Hong Kong's public works. Despite project complexity,
policy-aligned tender documents were developed in just four months. The new
framework streamlines GI procurement, enabling faster work order issuance,
predictable delivery schedules, and improved resource planning across a growing
pipeline of public projects. To date, measurable sustainability benefits include
shorter pre-construction periods, minimised rework, and lower carbon intensity.
This approach enhances supply chain efficiency and is now regarded as a
benchmark for future public works procurement in Hong Kong.

Hang Seng Bank Limited – Hang Seng Bank Headquarter Workplace Transformation & Main Branch Renovation

Hang Seng Bank HQ workplace transformation and main branch renovation project exemplifies excellence in sustainable banking facility. This comprehensive renovation achieved LEED, WELL through innovative technologies including an Al-powered Data Analytics System, microalgae and energised pedals. The project successfully implemented ABW while maintaining full banking operations. Notable achievements include ~13% energy savings, over 16,000 kg of materials upcycled, and 50% construction waste recycled. The transformation features cutting-edge solutions like chilled ceiling systems and automated blinds, demonstrating leadership in workplace innovation and environmental stewardship. The project has garnered multiple prestigious awards, including the Green Building Award 2023 Grand Award.

Thomas Chung + School of Architecture, The Chinese University of Hong Kong – Project Plum Grove: Collaborative Revitalisation in Mui Tsz Lam

Project Plum Grove revitalises the remote 360-year-old Hakka village of Mui Tsz Lam through restoring private houses for community building. Funded by the Countryside Conservation Office, the project developed a collaborative revitalisation model through a university-village partnership. Phase I (2020-2022) revived two ruined houses (Old House; Mural House) guided by place-inspired principles of in-situ, light-touch, and co-create. Phase II (2022-2024) further transformed Old House into "MTL Commons", a permanent multipurpose community hub integrating traditional construction with sustainable design technologies. Co-created with villagers, volunteers and students throughout, the project successfully established an education-research base as catalyst for longer-term village revitalisation.

Limited – HKGBC Guidebook for Sustainable Built Environment

Amid rapid urbanisation, concerted efforts to meet the sustainable development needs of Hong Kong have become increasingly important. Arcadis, along with its partners, URBIS Limited and Ecosystems Limited, were appointed by the Hong Kong Green Building Council (HKGBC) to develop the HKGBC Guidebook for Sustainable Built Environment ("Guidebook"), which provides practical design strategies and recommendations for the development of precinct-scale sustainable urban built environments in Hong Kong. This is the first published guidebook of its kind to provide design guidance for the holistic development of sustainable precincts in Hong Kong. The latest edition of the Guidebook was published in 2025.

CBRE Valuation & Advisory team (Hong Kong) has demonstrated exceptional resilience, innovation, and professionalism amid a year of economic uncertainty and market volatility, successfully delivering over 13,000 assignments valued at over HKD1,143billion. 




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
