Rob is the Transformation Lead, Asset Management and Maintenance at Kāinga Ora - Homes and Communities, where he is instrumental in reshaping and transforming asset management practices and the way maintenance is delivered to c75,000 state owned properties in New Zealand. In the little spare time he has, he is also a senior officer in the Royal New Zealand Naval Reserve where he is the Commander of Naval Personnel and Training. Prior to taking up his role at Kāinga Ora, Rob was the CEO of Development Christchurch Limited (DCL), where he led a team focussed on supporting development opportunities and facilitating investment into Christchurch with the goal of contributing towards making Christchurch a modern world class city. Prior to this, Rob has held a number of leadership roles in New Zealand and abroad responsible for infrastructure development and management. Rob is a Fellow of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors and has also been a Fellow of the Charted Institution of Water and Environmental Management. He has held a number of governance roles, including Deputy Chair of the New Zealand Registered Architects Board and the Arts Centre of Christchurch, Canterbury SPCA, St Andrews College and Dogwatch Sanctuary Trust.

I am truly delighted to be presenting this year's RICS Lifetime Achievement Award – this award recognises individuals whose careers stand as an example of excellence, service, and lasting contribution – not just to our profession, but to the communities we serve.

This year's recipient is someone whose career reflects exactly that spirit. Their leadership, service, and impact have been felt not only across New Zealand, but around the world.

Today, they lead transformation in asset management and maintenance, reshaping how thousands of homes are cared for across New Zealand. Their vision and dedication are ensuring that families live in safe, well-maintained, and sustainable housing.

Their career journey has been remarkable. They have served as a leader supporting development opportunities and facilitating investment into Christchurch; they have driven major infrastructure projects both in New Zealand and overseas, and led award-winning teams recognised internationally for excellence.

But their commitment to service extends far beyond these roles. They also serve their country as a senior officer in the Royal New Zealand Naval Reserve. This builds on a distinguished naval career that included service in peace support operations in Bougainville, recovery efforts in Samoa following Cyclone Val, and Antarctic survey missions contributing to climate change knowledge.

They are a Fellow of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors – a recognition of their commitment to the very highest standards of our profession.

Their contributions to RICS here in New Zealand have been outstanding: from serving on the RICS NZ Committee and the Christchurch Committee, serving as Chair of the Awards Judges Panel, contributing articles to RICS journals, hosting local member events, organising speakers and contributing as a regular panellist for market outlook events.

And their contributions do not stop there. Their sense of service extends into the community. They have held governance roles with the NZ Registered Architects Board, the Arts Centre of Christchurch, the Canterbury SPCA, St Andrews College, and the Dogwatch Sanctuary Trust – to name a few. Each of these roles reflects their values of leadership, compassion, and commitment to making a difference.

When you step back and look at their career and service, a clear theme emerges of leadership, resilience, an unwavering commitment to building stronger communities, and a profound sense of responsibility to others.

And in that, they perfectly embody the values that sit at the heart of RICS – professionalism, integrity, and a commitment to the public good. Their story reminds us that being a professional is not just about technical expertise – it is about using that expertise in service of others, creating positive change, and leaving behind something that endures.

Waiora 2 Capacity Upgrade - Digital Asset Handover

The Waiora Water Treatment Plant (WTP) capacity upgrade includes new underground services, a 250kL Raw Water Feed Tank, Hydro Cyclone Plant, Waste Attenuation Tank, Chemical Unloading Area, and a 40MLD microfiltration water treatment plant. Digital tools and processes were leveraged to enhance data delivery for this complex asset, mitigating risks in the asset capitalisation process. This reduced the amount of time a 'ghost asset' was visible in the council's asset management and finance systems, enabled early confirmation of the asset value and provided the ability to begin depreciating and maintaining the asset much sooner in comparison to traditional handover methods.

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Hiwa Recreation Centre

Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland and Colliers Project Leaders have delivered Hiwa, a 26,000sqm facility that delivers a world-class range of recreation and wellness spaces including a rooftop multi-sport turf and social area with panoramic views of Auckland city, the southern hemisphere's first glass sports floor with integrated LED markings, an aquatic hall with dive well, studios, zones, specialist rooms, squash courts, sports halls, bouldering wall, quiet zone, chill-out areas and an internal running track. The PM team overcame unique and complex challenges due to the confined footprint in a live campus environment and delivered some first-in-New Zealand solutions.


