Diploma in Adjudication in the Construction Industry (QCF Level 5)

RICS Dispute Resolution Service has developed a nationally recognised diploma which will give you the skills and knowledge to seek fee earning work as an adjudicator.

This 18 month, 4 module distance learning course (with some face-to-face tutorials and assessments), which is based on the National Occupational Standards developed by the Construction Industry Council, will cover the theory and practical skills you need to adjudicate on disputes.

onto the RICS Panel of Adjudicators**

On successful completion of the Diploma, candidates' details will be retained in a pool that will be considered for vacancies on the RICS President's Panel of Adjudicators (subject to any further assessment or mentoring that is considered appropriate) as and when they arise.

The diploma covers the practicalities of using adjudication from the perspective of a potential adjudicator or party representative and is suitable for those who already have a basic understanding of the general principles of adjudication and who represent, or intend to represent, parties in adjudication or who wish to progress to practise as an adjudicator.

The awarding body for these qualifications is the Royal Society of Public Health, who developed the qualification with RICS.

Level 5 Diploma in Adjudication in the Construction Industry

The Level 5 Diploma in Adjudication in the Construction Industry is a qualification consisting of four units. This consists of Units 1, 2, 3 and 4.

The qualification is based on the National Occupational Standards developed by the Construction Industry Council.

Holders of this qualification will have demonstrated their knowledge and understanding of the considerations relevant to the candidature, selection, appointment and discharge of the role of adjudicator, including the production of an enforceable Decision. The qualification is suitable for persons with experience in dispute resolution procedures, who have an understanding of the general principles of construction adjudication and who wish to progress to practise as an adjudicator.

The qualification is suitable for persons with educational qualifications of at least 'A' level standard or equivalent, and/or those with practical experience in dispute resolution procedures, who have an understanding of the general principles of construction adjudication and who represent, or intend to represent, parties in adjudication or who wish to progress to practise as an adjudicator. RICS is a recognised Course Provider with CI Arb. Those that successfully complete this qualification can apply for Fellowship membership of CI Arb (FCI Arb), subject to them successfully completing the CI Arb Peer interview.



*please note a minimum 70% pass rate must be achieved for Unit 4.

Unit 1 – the application of English law and the law of contract, tort and evidence to adjudication in the construction industry.

Unit 2 – the application of the law of adjudication to the construction industry.

Unit 3 – practice and procedure of adjudication for the construction industry.

Unit 4 – production of an enforceable decision by an adjudicator in the construction industry.

Format and content of an enforceable reasoned decision.

Assessment

Attainment of the learning outcomes for this unit will be assessed by a case study. Candidates will be required to produce an enforceable reasoned Decision based on material supplied in the case study. There are three tutorials as part of this unit.
